#### From Sandy P. Selden, Senior Warden

A few of you may have missed Emmanuel's 130th Annual Meeting which was held on an icy Sunday in beautiful northern Michigan last week. I have been asked to share one exciting report, and it is as follows:

"We've had a wonderful thing happen to Emmanuel recently and Father Greg has given me the honor of sharing this story with you today.

It is the story of a gift.



Emmanuel has become the beneficiary of a bequest. A man named Charles Wood attended Emmanuel at some point during the 1960's. He was from Illinois and, perhaps, a summer visitor to our area. He must have thought this church was rather special because he named Emmanuel in his will.

Charles Wood died in 1968, survived by his wife, Amy, and daughter, Mary Wood. Amy lived until 1981. her sole survivor, Mary, passed away in 2015, leaving her father's testamentary trust virtually unchanged. The trust specified that remaining assets, including farmlands near Peoria, Illinois, be sold and proceeds distributed to beneficiaries in percentages specified by the Charles Wood Trust. This has taken several years.

We heard from the Trust's legal counsel recently, and on December 27 Emmanuel Episcopal Church received a check for ten percent of Charles B. Wood's estate. That check amounted to \$565,000.00.

Our Finance Cell met to discuss what should be done with this gift. Finance advised vestry. Your vestry met in a special session and prayerfully considered this wonderful windfall, perhaps better labelled a Godsend.

What we've decided to do with this amazing gift is this: The Bequest will be used in three ways. First, as a tithe of \$56,500. to Outreach.

Secondly, \$100,000. will be used towards deferred maintenance of our church and for a makeover of the undercroft.

Part three: \$408,000. has been placed with Petoskey Harbor Springs Community Foundation as the Emmanuel Episcopal Church Bequest Fund.

At the Community Foundation, the bulk of this gift will generate yearly income which we will use to maintain this building, or for ministries which we can not quite yet imagine, ensuring that our faith and traditions continue well into the future."

We all can look forward to an exciting year in 2018 at Emmanuel! Thank you for your support and service, and blessings to you in the new year! Sandy

# Fr. Greg's Pastoral Letter for February

**Dear Emmanuel:** 

YOUR talents, and YOUR time have value.



**INCREDIBLE value**. You know this. That's why you often find it so hard to wait.

You could work at Manna, or Habitat, or go to Rotary or Kiwanis or Lions or Zonta. You could go on a mission trip to Cuba. You could do community work, or help your neighbors. You could visit a shut-in, or send a card to someone missing from church.. You have lots of talents; and there are lots of ways to spend them.

Add them up.

They will be tabulated each month and that number will be shared. It will be awesome.

My Big Huge Audacious Goal for 2018 is for Emmanuel to accumulate 10,000 hours serving our church and community. When we hit that number, we will have party. A Big Huge Audacious Party. And we will celebrate exactly how many ways we have opened and shared our hearts with our community.

It will be awesome. (Like everything is when you're part of a team!)

Grab a card, and let's go.



## A word on the budget for EEC, 2018

In mid-December the vestry put together a balanced budget for 2018, with income and expenses both equal to \$347,500.



Expenses include \$231,000. in salaries and benefits to staff, \$14,600. for utilities.

\$33,000. for building maintenance, \$43,250. Our Diocesan pledge, and \$5,500. Donations for music and flowers. Total in this category: \$327,350.


Plus Parish Ministries, cell group budgets, \$21, 150. TOTAL EXPENSES \$347,500.

This is the budget based on pledges received in 2017. The vestry seriously considered our finances, and prayerfully committed to a balanced budget. If more pledges come in for the new year there will be revisions.
