KITCHEN COMMITTEE

At the annual meeting on January 21st I spoke about the need for a new Kitchen Committee. I have been in charge of the two kitchens at Emmanuel for some years now – and I have been a committee of one. One person is not enough to have the responsibility for these kitchens. At various times we’ve had cleaning bees, and other spontaneous spurts of energy by different people - and these have helped... but we have many groups that use both kitchens on a regular basis, and we need a more regular, organized system.

I’d like to have a team of eight people work on this committee. We need two people to take charge for one week a month – or maybe you’d prefer to do it for a month at a time – and that would really make a difference. Most groups, like coffee hour, etc., clean up after themselves after using the kitchen. What more is involved? Think of your own kitchen at home. You plan, buy supplies, clean, and then do it all again every day and/or week! I would work with each team and go over the basic tasks. Either Leah or I purchase supplies. But more importantly we need to also look ahead and talk about ideas on what is needed for these two kitchens in the future months and years. The

Undercroft is going to be renovated soon and we should think about changes that are needed for the kitchen there, making the most of what we have and planning some workable improvements.

Two people volunteered immediately after the meeting - what a quick response! Thank you. Men, women, teens – all of you can do this, just as you all do to some extent in your own kitchen at home. Give me an email when you read this, and offer your help, ideas and input.

What is Lent Madness
The format is straightforward: 32 saints are placed into a tournament-like single elimination bracket. Each pairing remains open for a set period of time and Who will win the Golden Halo? people vote for their favorite saint. 16 saints make it to the Round of the Saintly Sixteen; eight advance to the Round of the Elite Eight; four make it to the Faithful Four; two to the Championship; and the winner is awarded the coveted Golden Halo. The first round consists of basic biographical information about each of the 32 saints. Things get a bit more interesting in the subsequent rounds as we offer quotes and quirks, explore legends, and even move into the area of saintly kitsch.
