## ANNOUNCEMENTS

### SUNKEN HAZARD – Enbridge Line 5 at the Straits

On Tuesday, August 22, at 7:00 pm in the Lottie Peterson Room, Gary Street will make a presentation of the issues revolving around Enbridge Line 5, with emphasis on the Straits of Mackinac and the surrounding areas including Mackinaw City, Mackinac Island, Cheboygan, Petoskey, Beaver Island, Bois Blanc Island, and St. Ignace. The pipeline, originally built in 1953, was designed to last 50 years. It is now in its 64<sup>th</sup> year. Line 5 runs from Superior, WI, to Sarnia, ON, crossing the entire length of the Upper Peninsula, and much of the Lower Peninsula. In addition to the Straits, the entire northern area of Lake Michigan, along with the northern area of Lake Huron are vulnerable. The pipeline also crosses rivers in the U.P. that flow into Lake Superior, as well as several iconic rivers in the Lower Peninsula, including Indian River, the Pigeon River, the Au Sable River and the Saginaw River. While Line 5 has never had a spill at the Straits, it has suffered 28 major spills elsewhere in its 645-mile journey through Michigan since 1968, and has spilled over 1 million gallons of crude oil within Wisconsin and Michigan.

All four Episcopal Dioceses in Michigan have passed a Resolution requesting the State to shut down Line 5.

Following the presentation, the meeting will be open for Q & A. Everyone is welcome! Encourage your neighbors and friends to join us.
