ENBRIDGE LINE 5 - A COMPLEX ISSUE

On **Sunday, November 10th at 11:45 a.m.**, Gary Street will provide an eye opening presentation on Line 5 as it impacts Northern MI. He has become a specialist on this topic. It will include a general presentation on Line 5. A discussion on how the 1953 easement with Enbridge will be wrapped into the presentation. The spill history will also be included. He has a map of the pipeline which should make quite an impact.

In addition he will include the impact Line 5 has on Michigan gasoline - the Marathon Refinery as well as the Toledo Refineries and Sarnia Refineries. He felt it important to add in a discussion of UP Propane - its need and alternatives. He will conclude with an overview of the proposed tunnel.

Where does Enbridge fit to all of this? This is sponsored by the Outreach Ministry.
